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INSTRUCTIONS FOLLOWING ENDOMETRIAL BIOPSY

- 1. You have just had a sample (biopsy) taken from the lining of your uterus (endometrial biopsy). You will probably have some light bleeding for a day or two, and you may have some mild cramps for the rest of the day.
- 2. If needed, ibuprofen (Advil, Motrin, etc.), 600 mg every six hours should be strong enough for the cramps. If there is significant pain, please call.
- 3. There should be no signs of infection such as fever, chills, or foul discharge. If any of these develop over the next few days, please call.
- 4. There should be no heavy bleeding, and the menstrual cycle should be no different. Please call for abnormally heavy bleeding.
- 5. Results will be available in about 1 week.
 - ❖ If your biopsy was done because of abnormal bleeding or an abnormal pap smear, simply call in 1 week and ask if the result is available. If it is, then speak with your doctor about the result.
 - ❖ If your biopsy was done for infertility, make sure you know the first day of the period which started after your biopsy so your doctor may interpret the biopsy result.
